The purpose of SAMHSA’s Opioid State Targeted Response (STR) grant is to provide prevention, treatment, and recovery support services to address the opioid abuse problem throughout the state (including both heroin and pharmaceutical opioids). This grant will provide Florida with \$27,150,403 per year for up to 2 years (for a total of \$54.3 million over the 2-year period).

Budget period: 5/1/17 – 4/30/18

Project period: 5/1/17 – 4/30/19

At least 80% of the award must be spent on opioid use disorder treatment (particularly medication-assisted treatment) and recovery support services.

SAMHSA stipulates that grantees must begin delivering services within 4 months of receiving the award.
