

AUXILIARY AIDS SERVICES

TANF'S GOALS

To make sure that children are safe in their homes or the homes of relatives and that parents are prepared to enter and retain employment.



Central Florida Cares Health System, Inc. manages TANF funding used to provide services to families receiving welfare benefits and families at-risk of receiving welfare benefits who may suffer from substance abuse and/or mental health illnesses.

TANF MISSION

The TANF Substance Abuse Mental Health (SAMH) funding provides services to parents who are experiencing employment and family instability due to substance abuse and/or mental illness.

SERVICES

Mental health or substance abuse treatment services may include:

- Assessment*
- Case management*
- Day treatment*
- In-home services*
- Outpatient services*
- Residential treatment*



ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

Families receiving temporary cash assistance, relative caregiver payments, food stamps, or the children in the family are eligible for Medicaid

-OR-

The family's income meets federal poverty level

-AND-

the family meets one of the following criteria:

- A pregnant woman.
- A parent or relative caretaker with one or more minor children living in the home.
- A non-custodial parent with a court order to pay child support.
- A Supplemental Security Income (SSI) program, or a Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) family.
- If your children have been removed from the home by the Child Welfare Program and getting them back is part of the treatment plan.
