

# Temporary Assistance to Needy Families (TANF)

TANF Mental Health and Substance Abuse funding offers outreach, screening, assessment, case management, and treatment services to parents who are experiencing employment and family instability due to substance abuse and/or mental illness.

## ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

*Families receiving temporary cash assistance, relative caregiver payments, food stamps, or the children in the family are eligible for Medicaid*

**-OR-**

*The family's income meets federal poverty level*

**-AND-**

*the family meets one of the following criteria:*

- A pregnant woman.
- A parent or relative caretaker with one or more minor children living in the home.
- A non-custodial parent with a court order to pay child support.
- A Supplemental Security Income (SSI) program, or a Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI) family.
- If your children have been removed from the home by the Child Welfare Program and getting them back is part of the treatment plan.
