

OPIOID CRISIS HELP IS HERE



DID YOU KNOW 72,000 Americans overdosed in 2017, a record number that reflects a 10% increase, according to new preliminary estimates from the Centers for Disease Control (New York Times, 2018).

How soon can I get help?

Crisis counseling is available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year by simply dialing 2-1-1 on your phone. You may contact a treatment provider directly and they will discuss walk-in and appointment options with you.

What will I have to pay?

You will be screened for financial eligibility during your first appointment. Insurance coverage/lack of coverage, income, and family size will determine where you fall on a sliding fee scale. Many patients pay only copays or reduced fees. You may even qualify for free services.

Opioid addiction affects many aspects of our communities; such as, public and private sector employers, tourism, education, law enforcement, criminal justice system, child welfare, and hospitals...all taxpayers. Most importantly it affects families, children, and our consumers. It affects **EVERYONE**. How can you help? Educate yourself. Learn what signs to look for and what resources are available?

Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) - Methadone, Buprenorphine, Vivitrol and OBOT; Clinical Counseling Services; Detoxification (Detox); Residential; and Outreach and Education.

Call **911 immediately** if a person exhibits any of these symptoms:

- Inability to think, talk, or walk normally
- Extremely pale and/or feels clammy to the touch
- Body goes limp or weakness
- Fingernails or lips have a purple or blue color
- Vomiting or making gurgling noises
- Cannot be awakened or are unable to speak
- Trouble breathing or shallow breaths
- Heartbeat slows or stops
