### **Approve Minutes**

A motion to approve the December 9, 2020 minutes as written was made by Wayne Holmes, David Solomon seconded; motion passed. There were 3 ayes and no nays.

### Form 990 Presentation

Farlen Halikman CPAs for Moore, Stephens, Lovelace, indicated the Form 990 is not complete. He will present the Form 990 at the Finance Committee on January 29, 2021.

### **Financial Report**

The CFO reviewed the November financials. The balance sheet details out the current assets of \$18,398,189, of which \$7,358,202 is in cash. The balance sheet has been stable with minimal changes year to date thru November 30, 2020.

The Statement of Revenues and Expenses for the last 3 months and YTD is on page three. Expense activity has been positive to budget. YTD FY20-21, we are positive vs budget operationally in the amount of \$100,900.

Pages 4-6 are utilization expenditures for Mental Health and Substance Use by OCAs, providers, and rates. Details were provided related to the OCA's where spending year to date was underutilized.

Page 7 is showing how much has been spent on their entire budgets, ranking from largest contract down to smallest programs.

Pages 9-10 are Provider Expenditures year to date. An outline of contract amendments this fiscal year were shown on page 11.

Wayne Holmes made a motion to approve the November Financial report as presented. David Solomon seconded; motion passed. Voting occurred individually and there were 4 ayes and no nays.

### **Organizational Updates**

- Budget Reduction no new updates until the legislative session in March.
- CARES funding Receiving \$3.3M
- Meeting with legislative representatives and attending legislative delegations.
- Worked with Senator Brodeur and Rep. Plascencia to sponsor Adult MRT and submitted applications, budget, and summary for \$1.3M for our region.
- CFCHS Telework and Staffing may bring back staff on a rotating basis in February.
- Network update working through some areas regarding budget cuts in children's services.
- Strategic plan at February Board of Directors' meeting. SWOT going out to members the first week of February.
- CFCHS' Officer Terms expire June 30, 2021.
- Partnered with Lutheran services of Florida and Southeast Behavioral Network to provide Project Opioid webinars.
- CFCHS' Policy Review board members to review new and amended internal policies.
- Received \$12K from Community of Brevard Foundation for law enforcement personnel for mindfulness training and also \$1000 from TD Charitable Foundation for social workers for the network. These trainings will be recorded and added to CFCHS' website.
- Website launch is nearly ready for completion.

### **Other/Public Input**

Ian Golden stated he was informed of a little over \$18M for rental assistance. Information will be passed on to providers.

### **Meeting Called to Order**

The Central Florida Cares Health System, Inc. (CFCHS) Executive Committee meeting was held on Wednesday, December 9, 2020 at 2:00 p.m. at Central Florida Cares Health System. The President called the meeting to order at 2:04 pm.

### **Audit Presentation**

Farlen Halikman and Sydney Webber, CPAs for Moore, Stephens, Lovelace, gave a presentation on the independent audit. A draft copy was presented for review. CFCHS received a clean audit with no audit adjustment and no deficiencies with either federal or state. CFCHS is considered low risk. Farlen complimented the Finance Department for a job well done and especially since the CFO was a newly hired employee. Sydney complimented the COO for answering questions, her willingness to explain and guide to communicate effectively, and lead to the efficiency of the operations of the audit.

Ian Golden made a motion to approve the audit as presented, Wayne Holmes seconded; motion passed. There were 4 ayes and no nays.

The audit will be made part of the consent agenda for the February 2021 board meeting. The 990 will be reviewed by the Finance and Executive Committees in January 2021.

Ian Golden made a motion to authorize the submitting all documents necessary for filing in anticipation of presentation to the board, David Solomon seconded; motion passed. There were 4 ayes and no nays.

### **Approve Minutes**

A motion to approve the October 14, 2020 minutes as written was made by Wayne Holmes, Ian Golden seconded; motion passed. There were 4 ayes and no nays.

### **Financial Report**

The CFO reviewed the October financials. The balance sheet details out the current assets of \$20,179,290, of which \$9,132,123 is in cash. The balance sheet has been stable with minimal changes year to date thru October 31, 2020.

The Statement of Revenues and Expenses for the last 3 months and YTD is on page three. Expense activity has been positive to budget primarily to continued reductions in travel and savings from still needing to fill staff positions. YTD FY20-21, we are positive vs budget operationally in the amount of \$181,734.

Pages 4-6 are utilization expenditures for Mental Health and Substance Use by OCAs, providers, and rates. The CFO, CEO and COO provided details related to the OCA's where spending year to date was significantly underutilized year to date. CEO and COO discussed in greater detail reasons for underutilization of Forensic Transitional Bed, Emergency COVID-19 Grant, Seminole County Sheriff's Office ARC Partnership and SOR Recovery Community Organizations.

Pages 7-8 show the same information in graph form. Pages 9-10 are Provider Expenditures year to date. An outline of contract amendments this fiscal year were shown on page 11, with more details shown on pages 12 and 13. Discussed funding differences between Amendment 44 and 46, highlighting an increase of just over \$8 million a majority of that being non-recurring funding for FY20-21.

Wayne Holmes made a motion to approve the October Financial report as presented. Ian Golden seconded; motion passed. Voting occurred individually and there were 4 ayes and no nays.

### **Organizational Updates**

- Budget Reduction 3% reductions (\$1.6M) may be implemented in legislative session in March 2021.
- Meeting with legislative representatives revolving around MRT in Orange, Brevard, and Seminole counties, and peer support in Osceola County.
- CFCHS Telework and Staffing may bring back staff on a rotating basis after the first of the year.
- Received \$386K in recurring funding for school technology with telehealth. Need to assess, procure, and implement in 90 days.
- Working with Project Opioid with webinars and looking at a statewide approach.
- East Orange county project targeting communities with increased overdoses is still evolving.

- CFCHS' Policy Review board members to review new and amended internal policies. An Ad Hoc Committee will be formed by the Board President starting in January.
- MEs are exploring a revenue maximization white paper and are in initial phases.

### **Investigation Report**

Ian Golden indicated the final investigation report states unsubstantiated allegations. DCF will be notified of the results. A letter written by the chair of the committee and approved by the HR attorney will be sent to the complainant stating no PTO will be paid out upon separation from employment. An update will be provided to the full board in February. Suggestions for the CEO were shared with her by the committee chair at an in-person meeting and followed up with an email.

### Other/Public Input

Ian Golden stated he would like to publicly notice where board members attended the same meeting revolving around budget reductions and would like to disclose.


