Meeting Called to Order

The Central Florida Cares Health System, Inc. (CFCHS) Finance Committee Meeting was held on Friday, October 29, 2021, at 1:00 p.m. The Treasurer called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

Treasurer's Report

Kelly Velasco made a motion to approve the June 25, 2021 minutes, Amber Carroll seconded, motion passed.

Bill Vintroux made a motion to approve the September 24, 2021 minutes, Kelly Velasco seconded, motion passed.

Financial Report

The Treasurer reiterated that providers were being paid monthly at a rate of 1/12 of the annual budget during the first quarter and totals will be trued up in the second quarter when all data is captured in FASAMS. The financials are an abridged version due to data issues within the FASAMS data system.

The CFO reviewed the abridged September financials that include June 1, 2021, through September 30, 2021. Nothing abnormal to report in the financials. Cash in the bank and Accounts Receivable is at \$23.98M. Short Term Liabilities totaling \$16K was a payback from a provider from a prior year owed to DCF.

The Statement of Revenues and Expenses for the last 3 months and YTD is on page three. No major activity outside of the normal. A refund on general liability insurance is reflected in

August, but September shows the number going up. The cyber insurance renewal was received and will be active through January 1, 2022. A broker in Lake Mary is well used by providers and other MEs and switching companies will result in a 30% savings in cyber insurance.

The CFO informed the committee of the security breach with one of our providers and their email was hacked. The hack gave us an erroneous EFT enrollment and looked legitimate but was fake. The transaction was reversed from the bank, the money credited back to CFCHS' bank account. A procedure was implemented when a change their EFT information is requested, a test transaction will be sent, and the provider will need to verify that it hits their bank.

DCF Amendments were shown on page 4. Amendment 51 has been approved, is retro to October 1, 2021, and adds \$7.4M into the budget, raising the total budget to \$96M. The FY 2021-22 Schedule of Funds were discussed on pages 5-7. The yellow highlighted OCAs are new funding dollars from Amendment 51.

The Chief Information Officer made the following comments:

- o New data system went live July 1, 2021.
- o Majority of providers perform direct data entry into the CFCHS data system and are reporting successfully.
- o Half of the providers who perform file upload are successfully reporting. Unfortunately, this data reporting accounts for approximately 18% of the normal service volume, with the largest providers seeing the greatest problems.
- o Different reasons why each provider is not successfully reporting, so there is no simple solution.
- o Recent progress seen from all providers towards successful data submission.

A motion to approve the abridged September financial report with caveats was made by Kelly Velasco, Tracy Lutz seconded, motion passed.

Finance Department Policies

The Finance Department policies were emailed to the committee for review and input to be discussed at the next meeting.

The Chair asked each provider to give an update for their agencies.

Meeting Called to Order

The Central Florida Cares Health System, Inc. (CFCHS) Finance Committee Meeting was held on Friday, June 25, 2021, at 1:00 p.m. The Treasurer called the meeting to order at 12:56 p.m.

Treasurer's Report

A motion to approve the minutes from June 4,2021 as written was made by Kelly Velasco, Scott Griffiths seconded; motion passed.

Financial Report

The CFO reviewed the May financials. The balance sheet details out the current assets of \$20,387,054, of which \$4,997,141 is in cash. The April invoice came in on June 7, so it did not quite make it to the balance sheet. The PPP loan is off the liabilities side and will start showing in revenues as other revenue. May services were up and is reflected a rise in Accounts Payable at the end of May. May 2021, provider invoices will be paid in full, in the month of June. There is more than enough adequate cash to pay for June's provider invoices the last week of July 2021. Additionally, during the first 2-3 weeks of July, DCF normally provides CFCHS with a 2-month advance for the next contract year.

The Statement of Revenues and Expenses for the last 4 months and YTD is on page three. There was an increase in program services for the month of May. Outreach and awareness expenses are for project opioid webinars. A partner ME paid us their prorata share for the project in May, as reflected in the negative expense for the month. CFCHS has a final payment due in June just under 26K. The entire project came out to \$75K, less a \$50K share from two partner ME's. Software development upgrades in FASAMS need to be paid and the vendor was asked to provide an invoice by June 30 to be incorporated into the accrued June financials.

Pages 4-6 are utilization expenditures for the Managing Entity, Mental Health, and Substance Use by OCAs, providers, and rates. The CFO provided details related to the OCA's where spending year to date was approaching normal expected levels year to date for some and will hit the target by year end, others that may not hit their target by year end, and potential reallocation of some OCAs.

Page 8 is the utilization rate YTD by provider in a graphical format. The same provider expenditure totals are shown on page 9, in a numerical table format. Page 10 shows the DCF amendments thru 06/01/21.

A member asked if IDP utilization is being drawn down slower due to the way it is required to be reported. These funds are usually drawn down in the first few months. The CEO will research and get back with the member.

A motion to approve the May financials as presented was made by Scott Griffiths, Kelly Velasco seconded; motion passed.

Potential New Finance Committee Members

This is scheduled for Friday, August 27, 2021, at 1:00 pm.

Tracy Lutz and Amber Carroll's applications were previously emailed to members for consideration to the Finance Committee.

Scott Griffiths made a motion to approve Tracy Lutz and Amber Carroll as new members to the Finance Committee, Kelly Velasco seconded, motion passed.

Other/Public Input:

- The CEO commented that the Project Opioid production of the webinars will be redone due to poor production quality.
- The August Board of Directors' meeting will be handled slightly different relating to SB96 and the Conflict of Interest. All provider contracts that are up for renewal will be reviewed one at a time. If a Board Director has a conflict of Interest as each respective contract comes up for vote, the board Director will remove their self from the room, and the remaining Board Directors will vote at that time.
- The CFO updated members on the DCF provider reconciliation process. It was noted for the providers and their auditors to attend a training conducted by CFCHS in July.

The Central Florida Cares Health System, Inc. (CFCHS) Finance Committee Meeting was held on Friday, September 24, 2021, at 1:00 p.m. Bill Vintroux called the meeting to order at 1:03 p.m.

Treasurer's Report

The Committee did not have a quorum. The minutes will be presented at the next meeting.

Financial Report

The CFO reviewed the August financials that include June 1, 2021, through August 31, 2021. The balance sheet shows the DCF 2-month advance in July in cash. CFCHS did not receive the Schedule of Funds until the end of September so the advance received was based on the original contract. The balance sheet reflects more receivables in cash in August due to a timing issue with DCF.

The Statement of Revenues and Expenses for the last 2 months and YTD is on page three. No major activity outside of the normal. A refund on general liability insurance is reflected in August; however, cyber protection insurance premium will be going up.

DCF Amendments were shown on page 4. Amendment 50 has been approved and is retro to July 1, 2021. The FY 2021-22 Schedule of Funds were discussed on pages 5-7.

There was discussion among members about the challenges of the new FASAMS system.

The CFO indicated that DCF's Secretary approved the CARES Act funding expanded use of funds proposal submitted by CFCHS. The Financial Accountability Office liked CFCHS' proposal enough that they reached out to other MEs to share this option for them to consider as well.

The Schedule of Funds shown does not reflect adding in the carry forward funds yet. The green column shows the total for the coming year. The blue column shows growth/reduction in that segment or individual OCA. FACT substance use program is moving over to ACHA reflected at \$4M on page 7 and was discussed.

The CFO indicated the employee health insurance premiums in July rose. Management decided to cover the cost of the increase for each employee.

The Finance Department policies will be emailed to the committee for review and input to be discussed at the next meeting.

The Chair asked each provider to discuss their challenges in their agencies.

The COO discussed the memo sent to providers stating on October 1, 2021, provider invoices will be paid based on units in the system. Providers needing any technical assistance can reach out to the CIO.
