#### Meeting Called to Order

Central Florida Cares Health System, Inc. (CFCHS) Board of Directors' meeting was held on Thursday, February 16, 2023, at 3:00 p.m. at 707 Mendham Blvd., Suite 201, Orlando, FL 32825. The President called the meeting to order at 3:01 p.m.

#### **Consent Agenda**

Ken Peach made a motion to approve consent agenda items, Joel Hunter seconded; motion passed.

#### **Organizational Updates**

- Legislative committees and session. Meeting with representatives.
- Videos being created 9 segment CIT training videos for first responders used during shift changes.
- Marchman/Baker Act bills being introduced about these acts; changes to come.
- Governor's office released \$126M for the behavioral health system, \$21M was held back. CFCHS is working with DCF; the review process for the remaining funds has gone by the house and senate and they revised some language to focus on work force development. Additional dollars should be incorporated into our contract at a later time.
- Opioid settlement not exactly sure when the ME will be receiving funding or how much. Logistics are still being discussed in Tallahassee.
- Medicaid Reenrollment starting in April 2023, DCF will be reenrolling individuals on Medicaid. There is a potential for more clients coming through our network as a result.

#### **Employee Introductions**

Jerrymar Foster, Quality Improvement Specialist, and Lillie Hopkins, Contract Manager, spoke about their roles at CFCHS.

#### **Ad-Hoc Nominating Committee**

Mark Broms was part of the committee for reviewing Lt. Alex Greenberg, Orange County Sheriff Office, as a potential board candidate. Mark gave a brief overview of the candidate's qualifications and recommended this candidate for board membership.

Mark Broms recommended Lt. Alex Greenberg as a new board member, Luis Delgado seconded, motion passed.

**Planning Council** – Has not been appointed yet.

<u>Other/Public Input</u> – Ken Peach and Donna Walsh were at a planning initiative meeting in Seminole County today and disclosed they were assigned to the same table but did not discuss CFCHS business.

#### Financial Report - December Financials

The CFO reported on the unaudited December 2022 financials. The Balance Sheet includes the balances from October 31, 2022, through December 31, 2022, as well as FY 22/23 budget and percentage of budget. Deferred Revenue increased in December, as funding increased with Amendment 59. Provider utilization is behind target year to date. Carry forward funds are

\$7.6M; Interest payable to DCF is interest earned in the money market account and is paid back quarterly.

The Statement of revenues and expenses, Program Services Revenue shows DCF, two CJMHSA grants, and a grant from Central Florida Foundation. There is an increase in provider utilization for December but still not quite at the level anticipated. Accounting fees billed in January are over budget YTD due to increased costs based on CFCHS' budget increases over the past three years. Dues and subscriptions are up due to FAME providing more services, inclusive of tax watch and partnering with CBC's.

OCAs – ME Admin expenses through the month ending December 31 were expected to be at a target of 39.3%, ended at 36% of the budget. Mental Health services were expected to be at a target of 44.9%, ended at 40.9%. Substance Use, 46.4% was projected, but 47.5% was used. OCA's with utilization under 75% of the target marked in red were discussed.

Page 7 shows carry forward expenditure utilization with a \$7.65M balance. There has been no expense movement in December.

On page 8, GHME1 Contract Amendments through Amendment 59 were shown; there were no updates from last month.

Amber Carroll made a motion to approve the December 2022 financials report as presented, Tracy Lutz seconded; motion passed.

#### **Audit Presentation**

Farlen Halikman, from Moore, Stephens, Lovelace, CPAs, gave the audit presentation for FYE June 30, 2022. There were no findings and was a very clean audit.

The motion to approve the FYE June 30, 2022 report and 990 tax return was made by Amber Carroll, Mark Broms seconded, motion passed.

Lisa Portelli commended the staff for an incredible job well done.

#### **Next Board Meeting**

The next Board of Directors' Meeting will be Thursday, April 20, 2023 at 3 pm.

#### **Meeting Called to Order**

Central Florida Cares Health System, Inc. (CFCHS) Board of Directors' meeting was held on Thursday, December 15, 2022, at 3:00 p.m. at 707 Mendham Blvd., Suite 201, Orlando, FL 32825. The President called the meeting to order at 3:01 p.m.

#### Financial Report - October Financials

The CFO reported on the unaudited October 2022 financials. The Balance Sheet includes the balances from August 31, 2022, through October 31, 2022. Accounts Receivable has an increase in August/September. In August, there was a delay in funding and paying providers resulting in an increase in liabilities. The Interest and other Payable to DCF balance of \$5.4M in August is the payback balance of unutilized funding from last year's contract. Current year excess revenues are generated by the two CJMHSA grants, whose respective expenses are lagging at this point.

The Statement of revenues and expenses shows two grants having a buildup of \$57K per month. Program services line revenue and the respective services expenditure side have an increase in September. Providers were paid on a pro-rata basis in July and August, with a reconciled payment process in September. In the first quarter some providers were slow in submitting data. October was more of a steady state of data reporting and utilization with just under 7.4M in service expenses. Conferences had a reclass of expenditures to grant expenses. The CFO recapped on dues and subscriptions expenses at a balance of almost \$48K. FAME had an increase and added a public relations component.

OCAs – ME Admin expenses through the month ending October 31 were expected to be at a target of 29.7% ended at 24.6% of the budget. Mental Health services were expected to be at a target of 29.3% ended at 27.3%. Substance Use, 30.5% was projected, but 33.3% was used. OCA's with utilization under 75% of the target marked in red were discussed.

Page 7 shows carry forward expenditure utilization with a \$8.2M budget, of which \$5.99M is provider services and \$2.2M is ME.

On page 8, GHME1 Contract Amendment 59 was executed November 16<sup>th</sup>, which increased the budget to \$105M.

Amber Carroll made a motion to approve the October 2022 financials report as presented, Kristen Hughes seconded; motion passed.

#### **Consent Agenda**

Mark Broms made a motion to approve consent agenda items, Debbie Owens seconded; motion passed.

#### **Organizational Updates**

- Strategic Plan Semi-annual update placed in the packet. Received notification from SAMSA today about an award on an application submitted. Targets were completed 6 months early but will continue to work on the targets.
- Private Donation to develop training videos targeting first responders and law enforcement shared during shift changes. Completion date is early March 2023.
- Selected to Present at Rx Summit 2023 in April 2023.
- Opioid funding distributed in counties. Meetings have been scheduled with each of the counties starting January 2023, to determine each county's plan, determine what the ME will fund so not to fund the same services, and for the ME to fund service gaps. The state's priorities are not mentioned at this point.

• Conversations have occurred to increase capacity in the network for service delivery. An injectable program has been discussed at the Orange County Jail around mental health.

#### **Ad-Hoc Nominating Committee**

Kristen Hughes, acting as Chair of the Nominating Committee, indicated the Nominating Committee interviewed Frederick Morello, of NAMI of Greater Orlando, and based on his various expertise with fundraising and clubhouses, the committee is recommending Frederick Morello as CFCHS' newest board member.

Kristen Hughes recommended that Frederick Morello become a new board member, Debbie Owens seconded, motion passed.

#### **Needs Assessment Presentation**

Therry Feraldi, Health Council of East Central Florida, gave a summary of the 2022 Needs Assessment.

<u>Planning Council</u> – Has not been appointed yet.

#### **New Employee Introductions**

Charity Mobley, Contract Manager, and Rachel Bishop, Children's Care Coordination Specialist, provided brief updates of their backgrounds and job duties.

#### Other/Public Input -

Anne Sutherland – Stated less crisis beds available statewide and crisis facilities have rescinded their designation status. DCF discussing ways to increase the menu of services so that waitlists become smaller.

Donna Walsh – Asked if a campaign for stigma has been discussed. The CEO shared all the prevention campaigns at present but welcomed a discussion.

Debbie Owens – Mentioned the board members to share in the cupcakes.
