HOW SOON CAN I GET HELP?

Crisis services are available 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

WHAT WILL I HAVE TO PAY?

Many individuals may qualify for **free services** or pay only reduced fees. You will be screened for financial eligibility.

Call **911 immediately** if a person exhibits any of these symptoms:

- Inability to think, talk, or walk normally
- Extremely pale and/or feels clammy to the touch
- Body goes limp or weakness
- Fingernails or lips have a purple or blue color
- Vomiting or making gurgling noises
- Cannot be awakened or are unable to speak
- Trouble breathing or shallow breaths
- Heartbeat slows or stops

WHERE CAN I GET NARCAN?

Narcan, otherwise known as Naloxone, rapidly reverses the effects of an opioid overdose to prevent death. To access a Narcan kit, please contact your healthcare provider, CVS or Walgreens.
