#### **Meeting Called to Order**

Central Florida Cares Health System, Inc. (CFCHS) Board of Directors' meeting was held on Thursday, December 14, 2023, at 3:00 p.m. at 707 Mendham Blvd., Suite 201, Orlando, FL 32825. The President called the meeting to order at 3:06 p.m.

#### **Consent Agenda**

Ian Golden made a motion to approve the consent agenda as presented, Alex Greenberg seconded; motion passed.

#### **Financial Report**

The CEO notified the directors about a banking incident at CFCHS that occurred on October 25<sup>th</sup> resulting from a pharming incident where \$3.6M was accessed out of the bank account. CFCHS personnel immediately notified the Finance Chair, the Executive Committee, OIG, DCF, filed a police report, and established contact with the local US Secret Service Department to work with them for recoupment. CFCHS filed a claim with cyber insurance. TD Bank initiated a hold harmless process with all banks involved. The CFO went over what has been recouped to date, but indicated the process can take up to 9 months to recover the full amount. Additional safeguards and parameters have been put in place as a result.

<u>Auditor Presentation</u> – Farlen Halikman, from Moore, Stephens, Lovelace, CPAs, provided the FY June 30, 2023 report. It was a clean audit with no findings. The 990 will be presented at the next the Finance Committee meeting.

Ian Golden made a motion to approve audit and allow for additional language regarding cyber security on Note 8 before finalizing and submission, Ken Peach seconded; motion passed.

#### **October Financials**

The CFO reported on the unaudited October 2023 financials. Balance sheet reflects August, September, and October YTD. October had a big influx in cash due to timing of payments coming from DCF. September and October Accounts Payable went up due to provider's utilization.

On the Income Statement under Program Services Expense, Provider service activity in the network for the month of October is at \$8.643M. The current rent is \$18K per month through end of June, with a proposal from the landlord for the next 3 years with a 5% increase in rent each year. There is no CAM in the lease, and the proposed first year increase July 1, 2024, is under the market rate at \$18.90/ft. CFCHS accruing 5% per year, over 3 years is still below market in year 3.

Pages 4-6 show utilization through the month of October 31, 2023, by OCA. The ME Admin YTD target was 28.3%, but 24.4% was utilized. The Mental Health OCAs had a target of 32.4%, but ended at 29.9%, and Substance Use was targeted at 33.6% and ended at 30%.

Page 7 is a summary of the OCAs with low utilization year to date and explanations were provided.

Page 8 shows CFCHS's DCF Contract budget is \$123M with Amendment 66. Page 9 shows the history of DCF funding since FY 16-17. Last FY funding was \$118,478,306, with admin funding at \$4.2M, while the current FY has \$123M in funding, the admin funding decreased to \$4M.

Kristen Hughes made a motion to approve the October financial report as presented, Alex Greenberg seconded; motion passed.

Strategic Planning – Ken Peach presented the proposed Strategic Plan to members.

Wayne Holmes motion to approve the 2023-2026 Strategic Plan as presented, Kristen Hughes seconded, motion passed.

#### <u>Organizational Updates</u> – The CEO provided the following:

- GHME1 DCF has extended the submission date to February 13<sup>th</sup>.
- Phishing An employee was a victim of phishing. Now employees are directed to not approve an MFA unless you initiated it. No PHI was accessed or anything from our data system.

The Chief Information Officer spoke of created phishing tests and phishing campaigns to target staff. If an employee falls for the phishing campaign, the employee will take additional training initiated by Microsoft. For staff with reported issues, there will be more intensive training. He then went into the changes he has made to Edge and Google to block known phishing sites and turned on that protection that staff cannot turn off. Trainings are coming in the new year issued by the cyber insurance company.

<u>Planning Council</u> – Has not been appointed yet.

Other/Public Input – Babette Hankey congratulated the team for a clean audit.

#### **Meeting Called to Order**

Central Florida Cares Health System, Inc. (CFCHS) Board of Directors' meeting was held on Thursday, October 19, 2023, at 3:00 p.m. at 707 Mendham Blvd., Suite 201, Orlando, FL 32825. The President called the meeting to order at 3:00 p.m.

#### **Consent Agenda**

Ian Golden made a motion to approve the minutes as presented, Freddy Morello seconded; motion passed.

Ian Golden made a motion to approve the board renewal for Wayne Holmes, Debbie Owens, seconded, motion passed.

#### Financial Report – August Financials

The CFO reported the August 2023 financials were approved at the Finance and Executive Committees, however, there was one edit on the balance sheet under liabilities, deferred revenue funds had a reduction at the end of the year. The June 30th deferred revenue balance of \$6.43M and ending carry forward fund balance of \$1.73M, convert over to carry forward July 1, 2023.

Dan then reported on the unaudited August 2023 financials. The key item of note on the June 30<sup>th</sup> Balance Sheet is the advance due to DCF of \$1,400,785 for the payback on unused federal dollars for FY2022-23. This was significantly reduced compared to prior years, which were usually between \$5M to \$8M. The carry forward budget for FY2022-23 was spent down to \$1.729M. Deferred revenue of unutilized state dollars on June 30<sup>th</sup> was classed as carry forward on July 1<sup>st</sup>. Accounts receivable on August 31<sup>st</sup> grew to \$27M. This is due to DCF delay in processing the full FY2023-24 cash advance, July invoice and the June final reconciliation invoice. The other compounding factor in the receivables delay was DCF not signing the FY2023-24 contract amendment 65 until September 18, 2023. The DCF advance that is owed to CFCHS is accrued. Under liabilities, the interest and other payables due to DCF as of August 31<sup>st</sup> is \$1.439M. In September the DCF receivable balances will move from Accounts Receivable into Cash.

The Income Statement reflects June, June 30<sup>th</sup> YTD, July, August, and current year to date. CFCHS paid providers on a pro rata basis for July and August 2023. Program services in July were \$8.88M versus \$8.79M in August. A rebate of insurance of \$3K was received in August.

OCAs – ME Admin expenses were shown through the month ending August 31. Two OCAs, state opioid response discretionary Grant Admin Years 4 and 5 must\_be spent by Sept. 30<sup>th</sup> and are showing the target at an accelerated rate of 75%, versus 16.7%. ME Admin is underutilized overall, due to open staff positions.

Pages 5-6 show utilization by OCA, by provider. Mental Health services ended at 14.7% with a target of 17.2% and Substance Use services ended at 16.9% with a target of 18.1%.

Page 7 shows CFCHS's DCF Contract budget is \$115M with Amendment 65. Page 8 shows the history of DCF funding since FY 16-17.

Amber Carroll made a motion to approve the August financial report as presented, Alex Greenberg seconded; motion passed.

<u>Ad-Hoc Nominating Committee</u> – Debbie Owens presented three candidates for board membership.

Debbie Owens made a motion to approve three board candidates to CFCHS' board: Dr. Garrett Griffin, Robin Griffin-Kitzerow, and Justin Saenz; Wayne Holmes seconded; motion passed.

#### <u>Organizational Updates</u> – The CEO provided the following:

- DCF released the procurement ITN. This adds 8 additional counties to our region. CFCHS is gathering information from other ME partners and has hired a grant writer. The Board composition will be changing to reflect the 12-county region. The first draft of the ITN will be written by November 3<sup>rd</sup>. The final version will be reviewed by the Vice President, Babette Hankey from Aspire Health Partners, and CFCHS' new Contract Director. The application is due January 11, 2024. DCF will post the awards in March with a roll out date of July 2024.
- CORe Contract Brevard– The CEO reported on the activities regarding CORe and the agreements and requirement of October 1<sup>st</sup> execution. Two agreements were executed prior to October 1<sup>st</sup>. The Brevard EMS was not executed by October 1<sup>st</sup> due to County processes. DCF notified CFCHS of CAP with penalties effective October 12<sup>th</sup>. The Brevard EMS agreement was executed on October 10<sup>th</sup> prior to October 12<sup>th</sup>. The CAP is closed.
- DCF's Contract Oversight Unit just reviewed CFCHS' HR and Contracts Departments.
   CFCHS is waiting clarification on some items. CFCHS will be requesting an exit interview.
- Accepting no Board of Director resignations until after December.

<u>Strategic Planning</u> – Ken Peach presented the proposed Strategic Plan to members. He informed members that he has received SWOT input from internal staff and is presenting summary slides. During the presentation, three goals were presented to members. They discussed and implemented suggestions and modifications.

<u>Planning Council</u> – Has not been appointed yet.

<u>Other/Public Input</u> – Ian Golden and Ken Peach were at an October 4<sup>th</sup> Brevard Health Advisory Committee meeting. Ian is placing this in the record.
