**Meeting Called to Order**

The Central Florida Cares (CFC) Finance Committee Meeting was held on Wednesday May 13, 2026, at 1:00 p.m. Amber Carroll, Chair, called the meeting to order at 1:03 p.m.

**Treasurer’s Report**

*Freddy Morello made a motion to approve the March and April minutes as presented; Steve Lord seconded. The motion passed.*

**990 Presentation**

Forvis Mazars presented the 990 to members.

*Freddy Morello made a motion to approve the 990 as presented; Justin Saenz seconded. The motion passed.*

**Forvis Mazars Discussion**

After reviewing the form 990, Farlen Halikman from Forvis Mazars presented the Finance Committee with new overage charges related to the additional testing from the single audit.

The cost changes presented as \$75,000 of additional charges due to the fact of the single audit being changed in scope from two programs, one federal and one state, to a level of four federal programs and three state programs for compliance reasons.

Farlen then indicated that Forvis Mazars was willing to reduce the bill to \$5000 for each of the additional five program areas tested for the single audit.

Members of the Finance Committee and staff responded that these change orders coming are in the audit process. The Finance Committee further stated this change in scope should have been communicated earlier in the audit process which started in November with the delivery of the PAN. It was further stated by members of the committee that the failure of Forvis Mazars to communicate these change order until April 2026 has put CFC in a position of not being able to find any means to absorb and pay these additional charges that represent over a 100% increase in the budgeted and approved cost of the audit.

After further discussion, the committee and staff communicated that there was no way to pay any amount towards these charge overages.

Forvis Mazars then responded that they would put the pencils down and stop the work on filing the form 990 which is due on Friday, May 15th.

At that point Forvis Mazars was excused from the meeting. Upon leaving the meeting, Forvis Mazars left a paper copy of an invoice for the new overage charges in the amount of \$35,000.

*Steve Lord made a motion for the Finance Committee to authorize the CEO to discuss with CFC's attorney and to follow through on recommendations of the attorney as it relates to payment of auditors, Justin Saenz seconded the motion. The motion passed.*
